Testing Update

Globally – 4,915,004 + / 323,653 Deaths

USA – 1,528,661 + / 91,938 Deaths

PCM - Total Testing – 3,529

Total Positive - 449 (380 inmates, 69 staff 21 PCM staff, 48 County)

Currently 8 facilities with active cases of COVID, 9.7% of our facilities have active cases

Antibody testing have been done at several sites-total testing

~1050, total detected 176=16.7% of tested had antibodies

Medical Assessments

- Memos send to clients and PCM facilities on 5/19/2020
 - Clients - Returning to Normal letter
 - PCM Facilities - The 2nd wave – moreover undercurrent letter
- Seeing an increase in medical / mental health concerns with extreme segregation
 - Evaluate how care will be delivered in the future. Having patients up and moving is an important assessment tool.
 - Complete assessments in the medical area and mental health areas if possible. Providing care as normal or as close to normal for non-quarantined units.
 - Continue to evaluate on unit for quarantine and isolation units

Courts and Court Transfers

- Continued push to “get back to normal”
- Concerns with opening jails to soon and seeing a second wave

Operations Moving Forward

- Transfer from facility to facility memo sent 5/13/2020
- Coordination and communication
 - Testing continues. Test kits are maintained centrally in the PCM corporate office and dispensed to facilities as needed / requested.

- PCM requests that notification of transfers occurs as soon as known, so that testing kits can be obtained if need be.
- Outside consults
 - Outside providers continue to require COVID testing before seeing our patients
 - PCM recommends showering upon return – new clothing – new mask

BHS (Behavioral Health)

- People continue to struggle in the community – typically this will be amplified in corrections. We must continue to be diligent with mental health concerns
- Items noted in the community currently
 - Suicide rates on the increase
 - Increased anxiety
 - Increase substance abuse

- Masks
- Suicide precautions trumps COVID-19
