Testing Update

- World Health Organization – Asymptomatic spread of coronavirus is ‘very rare’ (Monday)
 - They are currently walking this back (Tuesday) Complex question and the Monday report was a small subset of studies. 16% of population may be asymptomatic and some estimate around 40% of spread is due to asymptomatic
- WV Testing
 - As of yesterday, WV has tested 7,493 and have results back on 5,598 with 8 positive cases (0.142%). We will still be testing an additional 5,000 incarcerated individuals in the state of WV and we will continue to share these results

Delay in testing Results

- We are currently seeing up to 7 days for results to return
 - This is causing treatments, housing and transports to be canceled. We are as frustrated as everyone and are working with the lab to improve the turnaround time. Mass testing is being down in MD, WV, NJ and many more.

Trending

- Areas with previous low involvement remain low, previous higher involvement areas remain high
- Locations that did not utilize mask are seeing increases

2nd Wave

- Continue to monitor
- Preparation – continue to follow procedures – maintain PPD supplies
