

**New Hampshire Temporarily Authorizes Out-of-State Medical Providers to Provide Medically Necessary Services In-Person and Through Telehealth**

March 23, 2020

Any out-of-state medical provider whose profession is also a licensed profession recognized within the state of New Hampshire will be allowed to perform any medically necessary service as if the medical provider were licensed to perform such service within the state of New Hampshire subject to the following conditions:

- The medical provider is licensed and in good standing in another United States jurisdiction.
- The medical services provided within New Hampshire are in-person or through appropriate forms of telehealth.
- The medical provider presents to the Office of Professional Licensure & Certification evidence that they are licensed in good standing in another jurisdiction. Such medical providers shall be issued an emergency New Hampshire license at no cost, which shall remain valid during the declared state of emergency.
- Medical providers shall be subject to the jurisdiction of the appropriate state licensing body while providing services in New Hampshire.
